Lakewood Ranch home sales soar in first quarter

The first quarter of 2017 saw a remarkable jump in Lakewood Ranch new home sales over the same period in 2016. There were 318 homes sold in the Ranch between Jan. 1 and March 31, compared to the 2016 total of 161 – a 98% increase. March's sales alone were phenomenal, totaling 114 versus last year's 42 ... a 171% increase year over year.

The notable sales numbers come fresh on the heels of having been named the fourth best-selling, master-planned community in the country for 2016, after having been in the top 10 for the five preceding years.

The pace and distribution of sales is especially encouraging, according to Laura Cole, vice president of marketing for LWR Communities, LLC. "We are seeing solid sales across all villages, price points, and product types," Cole said.

Sales are credited to the Ranch's successful market segmentation—the targeting of various age, income, and household segments with appropriately priced and designed residential product types and lifestyle amenities. There are now more than 20 builders in Lakewood Ranch with 50+ models, ranging in cost from \$200,000 to more than \$1 million.

The active employment market, coupled with great schools and amenities, continue to attract buyers, as does the availability of various healthy community features such as easily accessible parks and multiuse paths and trails that offer a variety of experiences, including biking, walking, running, hiking.

Marketing efforts have garnered a significant increase in traffic to the Ranch's website, and foot traffic to the information centers continued to be dominated by Floridians, both local and throughout the state; New York, Connecticut and New Jersey; and Washington D.C., Maryland and Virginia.

Coming online in mid-2017 is Lakewood Ranch Waterside, the newest village at the Ranch, located in Sarasota County. LWR Waterside will feature single-family homes,







child), and how he overcame many hardships for himself and his family to become the renowned ballet professional today.

Born and raised in Oriente, Cuba, Serrano grew up training in the National School of Ballet system, and went on to graduate from the National School of Arts in Italy in 1990. Upon his return to Cuba, he danced with Ballet Camaguey, and then joined the Youth Corps of the National Ballet of Cuba. Next, he became a principal dancer with the Ballet de Monterrey in Mexico. In 1993, he and his wife Wilmian Hernandez defected from Cuba. In 1994 they were invited to join the Sarasota Ballet, then under the direction of Robert de Warren, where they both danced principal roles until they retired in 2000.

In 2013 Serrano and Hernandez co-founded the Sarasota Cuban Ballet School (SCBS). SCBS is the first-ever school in the U.S. to exclusively teach the Cuban ballet style to beginning through pre-professional dancers. Serrano recruits the students internationally, regionally and locally.

Under Serrano's direction, SCBS's students have competed at multiple national and international competitions, where the school has earned top awards such as "best teacher" and "best school," and students have taken home exclusive awards including several gold and silver medals. Additionally, Serrano has taught as a guest at many prestigious schools throughout the U.S., United Kingdom, South America and the Caribbean and has served as an expert judge in international ballet competitions.

One of Serrano's greatest accomplishments is the success of his students who have gone on to perform and study at such prestigious schools and companies as the Dance Theater of Harlem, Milwaukee Ballet, Cincinnati Ballet, Tulsa Ballet, San Francisco Ballet, Ballet West, Boston Ballet, Ballet Manila, Ballet Municipal de Lima and the Royal Ballet School and Company.

Serrano was given a donation from the club.





You meet the most interesting people at a Memorial Day parade, and the folks who showed up to either march or watch the 2017

Bands, kids, flags and patriotism - what more could you ask for?
























District boards still mulling over cell phone issue

During the Lakewood Ranch Community Development District (CDD) board meetings in May, supervisors discussed the possible impact of new state legislation regarding cell phone service. Per the attorneys, the new legislation passed by the Florida legislature gives incorporated cities and counties the right to regulate cell phone infrastructure. Whether it may impact Community Development Districts is somewhat unclear. In any case, the measure must get the signature of the governor before it becomes law.

Since residents of Lakewood Ranch have been complaining for years about cell service in the community, the various CDD boards elected to hire a consultant to assess what type of improvements might be made to enhance cell phone reception, in order to be able to move rapidly to improve service once all the facts are known. The USA Group has already offered a plan to put up small towers on district property, which may be a better alternative to the possibility of large towers being constructed on county property.

Executive Director Anne Ross noted that Schroeder-Manatee Ranch, Inc. has agreed to be a party to this move to engage a consultant, and to share in the expense.

The consultant's work will cost the community a total of \$4,000, and will be shared by all districts.

WATER USAGE

Finance Director Steve Zielinski reported that irrigation water usage is up by a large amount, due to the drought conditions. This will result in higher costs for irrigation water.

While the use of soil moisture sensors helps to control over-watering, as District 5 Supervisor Marty Cohn noted, only 220 residents have taken advantage of the rebate program recently offered by installing these sensors in their irrigation system

Residents are encouraged to report any over-watering by their neighbors, as this costs the entire community money and wastes resources.

BALMORAL GATE TRAFFIC TIE-UPS

Engineer Richard Ellis reported that his firm has studied the problem of traffic tie-ups for vehicles entering the Country Club via the Balmoral gate, and has concluded that the problem rests mainly in situations in which a large vehicle, such as a construction truck, is part of the flow into that gate. There does not seem to be a large problem with automobile traffic alone.

ALGAE GROWTH AND POND CONDITIONS

With the lack of rainfall, and the hot temperatures that we have experienced lately, algae growth in our ponds has become a larger problem earlier in the season. Lower water levels exacerbate this situation, since algae growth is enhanced by sunlight passing through shallower water levels. Operations Director Paul Chetlain noted that Aquatic Systems has just completed treatments for algae blooms in area ponds, and that residents can expect less algae formation in the near term. Operations has also done some additional planting on the littoral shelves of some ponds, now that the water level has been reduced. One supervisor jokingly asked if this were a good time to remove some of the muck from the ponds' littoral shelves. District 1 Supervisor Gil Pearce commented on all the new "beaches" that we now have in Lakewood Ranch.

TRANSPONDER UPDATE

The Town Hall is currently looking into acquiring a new system to replace the equipment, such as the "readers" currently in use

with the transponders which Country Club residents use to gain access to their area. The current system is obsolete (Some of the older transponders will not work with certain readers), and some of the current equipment cannot be replaced, as it has been discontinued by the manufacturer.

LED STREET LIGHT INSTALLATION

The installation of LED streetlights in most areas is complete. District 5 supervisor Tom Leavey asked if some trees might need to be trimmed to make sure that the light from the new fixtures is getting to the areas needed. Operations Director Paul Chetlain replied that there are some areas in which the trees may need trimming so that the tree branches do not interfere with the projection of light from the new lamps.

District 6 supervisors tabled the discussion of what they will do regarding the LED lights in their District until their August board meeting. District 6 did not contract for the installation of the lights when the other districts elected to do so, electing to get a handle on how their residents felt about the idea before going ahead with a contract.



Construction begins on new LWR church

Have you ever seen a Catholic bishop, clad in his ecclesiastical finery and holding his crosier (the fancy staff which resembles a shepherd's crook), clomping over rough ground in an area which, until recently, had been covered in brush and spike-wielding vines?

Well, if you were at our Lady of the Angels Catholic Church in late February, you would have seen that unusual sight – and more.

Bishop Frank Dewayne of the Diocese of Venice in Florida, a large crowd of the parishioners of Our Lady of the Angels, along with their priests and a good-sized contingent of the Knights of Columbus, clad in their distinctive regalia, traversed that somewhat rough ground on their way to break ground for the construction of a new church building for Our Lady of the Angels parish.

They all gathered around an area which had been cleared and set up with a semi-circle of fresh dirt especially brought in for the groundbreaking. Bishop Dewayne commented on the efforts of parishioners to pitch in to grow the parish, as well as to fund the construction of the new church building. Father Mike Scheip, newly appointed administrator of the parish, and Father John Hoang, his associate, commented on the success of the parish, and thanked some of the officials, such as Schroeder-

Manatee Ranch, Inc.'s Rex Jensen, and Manatee County Commissioner Vanessa Baugh, who had helped make sure that all the various agency permits and other required paperwork items were completed correctly in time for the groundbreaking. The area upon which the new church building will stand was sprinkled with holy water and incensed by Bishop Dewayne.

Right about that time, a bald eagle soared overhead, a sight which has a special meaning for the people of Our Lady of the Angels, since there is an active eagle nest on the property, and there are requirements that any construction near an active nest be limited to a certain distance from the nest. (Eagle lovers take note: There will be a 330-foot distance from the nest to the structure of the new church!)

Then the fun part began. Bishop Dewayne, along with the priests and those parishioners who had purchased commemorative shovels created especially for the groundbreaking, started to heave chunks of dirt, signifying the start of the construction project.

Along with Lakewood Ranch, Our Lady of the Angels parish has grown by leaps and bounds since its founding in 1999. At that time, Father Damian Amantia, a Franciscan friar, celebrated the first mass of his new parish at the Living Lord Lutheran Church building, since there was yet no actual building to house the fledgling Catholic parish.

Several years later, in 2003, the building which currently houses the church was completed. However, even at that time, parishioners knew that the 2003 structure was only a temporary stop on the way toward building a much larger facility.

The current church building was built with a capacity of only 500 persons and, especially of late, ushers have had to



room only" status.

The new church building will double the capacity of the old one, in addition to providing space for a proper choir area, as well as a small chapel for celebrations which don't require the use of the larger main church area. The structure will be built with an eye for possible expansion, if need be.

Although Our Lady of the Angels parish has existed for less than 20 years, it has seen great changes - and not just in the number of parishioners. The original pastor, Father Damian, was transferred to St. Petersburg in 2011. He was replaced by Father Dan Smith, who had made his living as an accountant for a dozen vears before he decided that the priesthood was his real calling. Father Dan died, unexpectedly, in June of 2016, and, for the next several months Father John Hoang "took care of business" until a new administrator could be appointed.

The current, and recently appointed (he took over on Feb. 1.) administrator for Our Lady of the Angels is Father Mike Scheip, who has already made lots of friends within the parish community. One of his first moves was to add a mass at 12:30 p.m. on Sunday afternoon, a move that will relieve overcrowding – at least until the new church is completed in early 2018.


