






# Districts Cooperate for a "Brighter Turn" in Lakewood Ranch

Some residents of District 6 – "Country Club West," have been expressing their concern that the "deceleration" right-turn lane from northbound Lakewood Ranch Boulevard on to Balmoral Woods, and on into the Balmoral Gate, has been poorly lit at night. They asked their representatives if there could be additional lighting installed along that lane, so that any problems there could be seen before they potentially might contribute to an accident.

The Operations Department took a look at the situation, and concluded that an additional lighting fixture could be installed on an existing pole in order to make for greater illumination, at a minimum amount of cost, and in recognition that the additional lighting be directed only at the paved area.

But wait ... the other side of Lakewood Ranch Boulevard in that area belongs to District 1, and it was deemed prudent that the District 1 board of supervisors be given the opportunity to have the issue explained to them, and that they be able to voice their opinion on the move.

So, at the October District 1 Community Development District board meeting, the program was explained to the District 1 board, and they unanimously agreed that providing better lighting for that stretch of roadway was a good idea.

Cooperation among government officials: it's a beautiful thing.

### POSITIVE IMPACTS ON DISTRICT BUDGETS

Finance Director Steve Zielinski reported that a combination of payments in reimbursement for the expenses incurred by Lakewood Ranch districts as a result of Hurricane Irma, combined with a marked decrease in irrigation water usage – due largely to the installation of soil moisture sensors (SMS) at more Lakewood Ranch homes – has resulted in a positive cash flow over and above what was estimated at the time that district budgets were adopted.

Regarding the SMS program, almost all of the allotted 1,000 units recently approved have been installed, and only a few remain available.

### **BUDGET WORKSHOPS FOR FISCAL 2021**

Finance Director Zielinski noted that dates

had been established for all district and IDA budget workshops; they will be held beginning in March of 2020. The first meetings are scheduled as follows: (All meetings are at the Town Hall and are open to the public.) Residents are encouraged to attend and become involved in the process.

District 1 – March 23 at 3 p.m.

District 2 - March 26 at 3 p.m.

District 4 – March 9 at 2 p.m.

District 5 - March 26 at 10:30 a.m.

District 6 - March 24 at 10 a.m.

IDA - March 25 at 4 p.m.

Additional workshop meetings will take place at one-month intervals, ending in May.

### STORMWATER REPORTS

Engineer Richard Ellis said that all of the storm water reports required by the Southwest Florida Water Management District have been filed with that agency, and that SWFMD has accepted all of Lakewood Ranch's reports.

### PROPOSED MANATEE COUNTY STORMWATER ABATEMENT TAX

The Manatee County Board of Commissioners has recommended passage of a new tax in order to pay for improvements in the County's ability to deal with stormwater.


The County has come up with two options. One would have a lesser amount of money to improve current maintenance levels, in such areas as clearing drainage ditches more frequently to promote better drainage. The alternative would be a larger amount, which would enable the county to engage in improvement projects.

Based on equivalent dwelling unit (EDU) listings, option 1 would result in an additional tax of \$58.16/year, and option 2 would mean an additional tax of \$88.10/year, depending on the size of the home in question.

The tax would apply only to unincorporated areas of Manatee County, and would not impact incorporated cities, which charge their own such taxes.

Several Lakewood Ranch officials expressed alarm at this move on the part of the county, as Lakewood Ranch CDDs already have, as part of their own stormwater abatement efforts, made charges for such items a part of the taxes that their residents already



# Lakewood Ranch No. 1 in the Nation for Housing Starts in Third Quarter

Lakewood Ranch led the nation in annual housing starts for the third quarter of 2019, according to Metrostudy, a leading research and consulting firm specializing in U.S. residential markets. The Ranch's 1,467 new home starts exceeded those of other top-selling communities in Florida, including The Villages, as well as those in Las Vegas, Arizona and California.

"Lakewood Ranch was the top community in the U.S. ranked by annual housing starts in the third quarter of 2019," said David A. Cobb, region director for the South Florida, Sarasota and Jacksonville regions of Metrostudy. "This is the second quarter in a row that LWR has claimed the top spot."

Lakewood Ranch's sales – and subsequent starts success – is a result of its exceptional location, in part, according to Laura Cole, senior vice president, LWR Communities, LLC, but place is just one factor. "Our multi-generational approach and diversity of neighborhoods, as well as an ever-growing list of daily conveniences and social engagement opportunities, put us above and beyond other communities," Cole said.

The Ranch has 17 actively selling villages, including the three newest additions: Kolter's Cresswind, The Palisades, from Freedom Homes by D.R. Horton; and Woodleaf Hammock, fea-

turing M/I Homes and Meritage Homes.

Prices in The Ranch range from \$200K to more than \$1 million, providing a multitude of options for buyers, including condominiums, paired villas, and single-family homes.

Sales in Lakewood Ranch continue to come from throughout Florida, as well as from high tax markets in the Northeast and mid-Atlantic, such as New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Maryland. Over 25% of new home sales in Lakewood Ranch come from existing homeowners who are on their second, third, and even fourth home purchase in The Ranch. "As a community builder, this is a very rewarding statistic, as it tells us that our residents have truly made Lakewood Ranch their lifelong home," Cole said.

### LECOM Suncoast Classic Announces 2020 Tournament Dates

The LECOM Suncoast Classic golf tournament will return to the Korn Ferry Tour (previously the Web.com Tour) the week of Feb. 10-16, 2020. Lakewood National Golf Club in Lakewood Ranch will again host the 144 professionals competing for a \$600,000 purse and a chance to compete against the world's best golfers on the PGA Tour.

The 2019 LECOM Suncoast Classic named Mark Hubbard its first champion. Hubbard shot 26-under to secure the victory and propel his season toward success. After receiving his PGA Tour card in August, Hubbard is off to a strong start on the 2019-'20 PGA Tour circuit. He fell just short of his first PGA tour victory recently at the Houston Open, finishing in second place. Hubbard currently sits in seventh place in the FedEx Cup standings, with two top-10 results in his first five events.

"My win was so early in the year that I knew I had some work to do still to lock up my card, but I feel like I needed to come back onto this

Tour to learn how to win again," said Hubbard. "It was nice to accomplish my goal so early in the year. It almost came as a surprise to me. I thought that I would have to build all year to get into position to win, but to win it at the LECOM Suncoast Classic was unbelievable. It jumpstarted my confidence and I've been a different player since then."

The 2020 LECOM Suncoast Classic will provide another opportunity for a shot at the PGA Tour, as the tournament continues in its five-year commitment to the Suncoast area through 2023. Volunteer registration is currently open; tickets for the event are on sale now. More than 17,000 spectators came out to the event in 2019, and attendance is expected to reach 25,000 during the 2020 tournament. Children 17 and under, active duty military, veterans, and first responders all receive free admission to the tournament.

pay. (Note the previous comments about the reports submitted to the Southwest Florida Water Management District by Lakewood Ranch CDDs.) They feel that such a tax, if applied to CDDs and HOAs which already deal with such issues in their own areas, would constitute double taxation.

The County scheduled seven informational meetings, to get public comment on this issue. The Manatee County Board of Supervisors will vote on the plan at their Dec.10 meeting.

During a discussion on this topic at the District 2 board meeting, District 2 board chairman Pete Bokach suggested that Lakewood Ranch CDDs should make their opinions known to the county officials as one unified entity - Lakewood Ranch - so that the county folks know that Lakewood Ranch residents are speaking with one voice on this issue.

### PRESIDIO/RIVIERA DRAINAGE ISSUE

District 5 will contract with a wastewater expert in order to find the best solution to the drainage problem in Presidio/Riviera, before any actual work is approved.

### **CLUB SPOTLIGHT**

### LWR Digital Photography Club - Still Growing Strong

Quick – what Lakewood Ranch club started out in 2004 with just a handful or two of regular attendees at their meetings, and is now, arguably, the largest fun club in Lakewood Ranch? Give up?

It's the Lakewood Ranch Digital Photography Club (LWRDPC).

Back in 2004, when I first attended a meeting of the club, if there were a dozen people at a meeting, it was a big crowd.

And then, a couple of somewhat unrelated things happened.

First the digital photography revolution started to make

First, the digital photography revolution started to move forward at breakneck speed. Back in 1997, I attended a photographic seminar led by veteran wildlife and landscape photographer George Lepp, at an auditorium in Ann Arbor, Mich.

At the time, Lepp was asked by someone in the audience

At the time, Lepp was asked by someone in the audience whether film was better than digital photography. He commented that, at that time, the resolution quality of film was still superior to that of digital photographs, although he expected that digital resolution would be improving. He then pulled out a new-at-the-time digital camera, noting that this piece of equipment had a resolution of something like FOUR MEGAPIXELS. Lepp then noted that the cost of that camera (in 1997) was around five thousand dollars – for the camera body only – without a lens. Four megapixels? Your cell phone probably has a higher resolution.

Today, I own an "average" resolution digital camera with a resolution five times that of that high-end 1997 camera – at about one-fifth the cost! A friend of mine just purchased a new camera that can attain a resolution of 41 megapixels! And, new, creative computer programs make it possible to retouch and change your photos in ways only dreamed of a few short years ago.

This is kind of like the change in aviation from the "Red Baron" biplane era to the Blackbird happening in only about 20 years.

Ok, that's one factor.

The other factor in the growth of the Club is the huge growth in population in and around Lakewood Ranch. Fifteen years ago, when the Club got it's start, there weren't all that many people in Lakewood Ranch who owned a digital camera.

But Lakewood Ranch is now proud to advertise that it is the best-selling multi-generational community in the country. And this growth has happened during the digital revolution. Lots more people means lots more photographers. Add the digital camera factor, and you have the tremendous growth of the LWRDPC. The Club now boasts more than 300 members!

As digital photography is, in the minds of many, still in its

infancy, one goal of the Club is to educate their members to become better photographers, not only in the sense of learning the ins and outs of the "digital" part, but also the techniques of the art and design of what makes a great photograph.

In doing this, the club hosts educational sessions, not only in a "class" -type setting, but also in the way of field trips to various locations, in order to allow members the opportunity to sharpen their skills. This has also been a hallmark of the LWRDPC. The club gains members by providing value to the members.

The club starts out to learn about a prospective member's interests and needs right from the moment of their first contact. Visitors to the club meetings are asked, in addition to introducing themselves, to explain how they found out about the Club, what sort of photography they enjoyed, and what type of camera they have been using. This way, the Club members can get an idea of the new member's needs and aspirations. The evening I visited the Club, two new members came forth with different interests. Ana Bowers had used the internet to find "a photo club near me," and found from this research that the Lakewood Ranch Digital Photography Club provided the most complete, most organized, and most diverse opportunities in the area. Jason Winget joined the Club to further his interest in "low light" photography. The Club has specialty photographers work-

ing in many areas of the field, including videography.

The Club also has speakers come to their meetings both to enlighten and entertain the membership. During the October meeting, the presenter was Jennifer Khordi, a New Jersey-based specialist in cityscapes, aerial, storm and moon photography.

Khordi showed some of her work at the Club, including a number of shots of what has come to be known as the "Blood Moon," depicted behind structures such as the Statue of Liberty in New York harbor, and, perhaps the most dramatic, a huge "Blood Moon" rising behind the Manhattan cityscape.

In discussing the "how" of getting such a picture, Khordi noted that she used an app that pinpointed the location at which the moon would rise above the horizon. She then traveled to a location 25 miles away from the buildings, at a state park in New Jersey, and got a shot that looked almost as if the dark red moon was about to consume the city.

That photo was circulated by her agency to a large number of publications around the world in a very short time frame and now, several years later, she still receives royalties from fees for the use of that photograph!

Part of the fun of being in a photography club is the aspect of competition among the members. A particular theme may be selected for a monthly competition, with members voting on photos which their fellow members have entered do the best job of meeting the assignment, as well as having the best technique and impact.

The October winner was Cheryl Kurman, who won a blue ribbon for her photo of a lone woman huddled under a lamppost, titled "Alone Among Millions."

Joining the Lakewood Ranch Digital photography Club has other benefits, too. The Club provides opportunities for discounts on classes run by professionals, as well as money-saving perks such as a discounted digital camera sensor cleaning, to be done prior to the November Club meeting, at a cost of about half the normal rate.

The Lakewood Ranch Digital Photography Club is open to residents and non-residents alike, and you can check out the club's website at lwrdpc.com. The website contains some fantastic photographs created by club members.

If you're into photography and want to learn more about all that digital stuff, or just want a chance to meet other photo enthusiasts, check out the LWRDPC!

The Club meets generally at 6:30 p.m. on the third Wednesday of the month, at the Grace Community Church, 6932 Professional Parkway, east of Lakewood Ranch Boulevard, and south of University Parkway.



Marco's Pizza is a bit different, both in its origins and the fact that it is a franchise restaurant, owned by Nehal and Tushar Shah, who were long-time business owners in Pinellas County.

Marco's Pizza was founded in Toledo in 1978 by Pasquale "Pat" Giammarco, an Italian immigrant who came to Toledo at the age of nine with his father to produce their idea of the perfect pizza, "The Italian Way."

At Marco's Pizza, there is a slogan, "Hello Primo," which gives an indication about how the founder made sure that his pizza was going to be great

pizza. It means that the pizza dough is made from scratch every day - right in the local store - not frozen and brought in in cartons from a refrigerated truck.

The cheese in Marco's Pizza is different, too; it's actually a combination of three cheeses, blended to give the great flavor which pizza addicts love - and, here again - the cheese is fresh. The sauce is blended in-house, using imported herbs and spices – again, a tip of the hat to ultimate freshness

One hallmark of a good pizza place is variety. And Marco's Pizza shines in that department as


