



District 5 To Save Money By Re-Financing Bonds

During the November meeting at the Lakewood Ranch Town Hall, the board of supervisors of Community Development District 5 in Lakewood Ranch approved moving ahead with efforts to refinance district bonds, in order to take advantage of the historically low interest rates currently available in the marketplace.

The board voted to engage MBS Capital Markets, specialists in financing for special tax districts, to determine the re-financing of the District's bonds.

Brett Sealy, managing partner at MBS, made a presentation to the board, indicating that he felt that his company could negotiate the re-financing prior to the end of the year, at a rate that would save the District about \$24,000 per year. (Note: these bonds had been re-financed earlier, but there is still a cost savings to the District to re-enter the process at this time).

The move should reduce assessments slightly for District 5 homeowners, which would be seen in their tax bills beginning in late 2020.

In addition to the authorization to engage MBS, the board also voted to authorize staff to proceed with the bond refinance. Final approval is expected to take place at a special meeting scheduled for Dec. 23 at 10 a.m.

NEW GATE EQUIPMENT ISSUES

District 5 Supervisor Dave Emison noted that he had difficulty getting through the Players gate at Lorraine Road a few days prior. According to Operations Director Paul Chetlain, the old gate entry equipment was shut down during the second week in November. It was discussed that there may have been some possible interference due to Mr. Emison still having an old transponder on his vehicle.

BALMORAL GATE AREA TRAFFIC SIGNAL

According to information from Manatee County Commissioner Vanessa Baugh, a new traffic signal for the intersection of Balmoral Woods and Lakewood Ranch Boulevard is in the works, and is expected to be installed during the early part of 2020.

DISTRICT 1 TO REAPPLY FOR MITIGATION GRANT

For some time, residents of the Bluffs neighborhood in District 1 have been con-

cerned about erosion of the banks of the Braden River near their homes during heavy rainstorms. An earlier application for a mitigation grant was denied, so the District is going ahead with a second application for funds to deal with this issue.

The application process involves applying for a "pre-disaster mitigation grant" under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, a program administered by FEMA. The plan requires homeowners to go through their local government entities (in this case, Manatee County), which then pass the application through state agencies, with the ultimate funding coming from FEMA.

This funding from FEMA is dependent on congressional action, and getting a grant involves a very competitive process.

The idea of these grants is that communities that receive them can then take action now in order to mitigate threats, in order to prevent larger, much more costly problems in the future, thus saving the local community (and FEMA) money in the long run.

AUDITS

Finance Director Steve Zielinski reported that audits are underway, and that the results of the audits would be presented at the February CDD board meetings.

SUMMERFIELD-RIVERWALK HOA

District 1 Supervisor Preston Olinger reported that there would be two proposals to be voted on by District 1 homeowners, which could change policy regarding home rentals.

The first proposal would be to change the covenants to allow each neighborhood to determine whether to allow homeowners to lease their homes for a period of one year. (The current maximum is six months.)

The second proposal would require that home buyers not lease their homes for at least two years after purchase of the home.

BRADEN RIVER UTILITIES BILLING

Braden River Utilities, the irrigation water provider for Lakewood Ranch, will hold a meeting with district supervisors in January to inform them of the changes in Braden River's billing practice from a "calculated" billing for irrigation water, to a "metered" system. It is expected that the metered method will reflect a more accurate picture of exactly where the irrigation water is being consumed.



The holidays are here! December is a L time for celebration, for giving, and for loved ones. It is also a time for reflection as we close out not only 2019 but another decade as well. As we look back on both this year, I want to leave you with some financial perspective and some encouragement.

So often human nature makes us doubt that relatively "small" contributions will even add up to much, especially with news

headlines that cause some to fear the market and the future altogether.

First, travel back with me to the beginning of this decade. For simplicity's sake, we won't adjust these numbers for taxes or fees and will assume dividends are reinvested. If you had invested \$1,000 in the S&P 500 in January 2010 and then continued to invest \$100/month every month going forward, you would have seen a 13.03% return.

That may not surprise many who have watched their portfolios climb over the past decade. Even more compelling though is the look-

LWR Knights Hit a Triple Whammy for Charities

There is a certain amount of notoriety being created in the environs of Our Lady of the Angels Church, at the corner of State Road 70 and White Eagle Boulevard. Other than serving as the home for the parish, the church buildings also house meeting spaces for a number of organizations, one of the more significant ones being the Knights of Columbus-Saints Cosmas and Damian Council #13341.


This group of over 200 men from in and around Greater Lakewood Ranch has taken to heart the Knights motto: "In Service to One - In Service to All." Last year, this Council was awarded the Council of the Year award for the entire State of Florida, in recognition of their achievements in service. Some of their activities have included collecting food for the St. Joseph's Food Bank on the west side of Bradenton, manning a booth at the Hunsader Farms Pumpkin Festival to raise money for Special Olympics, and purchasing winter jackets for dozens of kids who might otherwise not have a warm jacket to wear to school when winter winds start to blow across Florida.

This year, however, the Knights of Council #13341 have taken on a trio of projects as part of their "Culture of Life" effort – projects which are ushering a new era of service to the community.

First of all, the Knights have entered into a partnership with Tidewell Hospice to assist in providing end-of-life services for patients who are receiving hospice care not only in Tidewell's own facilities, but also in their own homes. Volunteer Knights are going through training to enable them to provide companionship for their terminally ill neighbors, and to help out with respite care for family caregivers so that they can "do their own thing" for even a short period of time spent away from the family members for whom they are caring.

The Knights also are going through a very special set of training sessions to enable them to provide care and recognition for military veterans at the end of their lives. Some of these veterans have outlived their family members, or their friends and family may live in other parts of the country, so the presence of these specially trained Knights means a





great deal to them in their final days. One of the services provided by the Tidewell-trained Knights is a special "pinning ceremony," during which the veteran is presented with a special recognition pin for his or her service to our Country. Only Knights who are themselves veterans can participate in this solemn ceremony.

Second, the Knights have partnered with Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital Foundation in St. Petersburg to assist in raising money to help defray the expenses of running the only children's hospital in the Johns Hopkins Group.

Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital serves 17 counties in Florida. They have an outpatient center in Sarasota on Clark Road, in addition to their main hospital in St. Pete. They also provide all of the clinical care at the IMG Academy. The main hospital, according to Dee Dee Fusco, of the Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital Foundation, treats kids who are "the sickest of the sick," and is the only acute care facility specifically for children in the area. They have a clinic for juvenile diabetes, and specialize in cancer treatment for children. Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital also functions as the labor and delivery unit for Bayfront Medical Center. Seventy percent of parents whose children are admitted to All Children's Hospital lack the ability to pay for the very costly treatment which their children are receiving, and that's where the fundraising comes in, with \$18-20 million a year being raised to fund the care for these sick kids.

So, what did the Knights do? They decided to capitalize on things loved by almost all guys (and girls, for that matter) – cars, music, and food.

At the end of September, the Knights held a "car show cookout" on the grounds of Our Lady of the Angels, to benefit the Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital Foundation. In the spirit of "if you show the cars, the people will come," cars of all sorts of years, makes and models flooded into the Our Lady of the Angels parking lot, including old and new Corvettes, classic '55, '56, and '57 Chevys, a '55 Ford Thunderbird, a couple of early '50s Ford sedans, and a real rarity – a genuine 1960 Edsel – one of the last few produced before Ford pulled the plug on that car line only weeks after the start of production. Others included a Dodge Viper, a "woody" station wagon that carried two surfboards on its roof, and a Plymouth Road Runner convertible. Camaros, Mustangs, a 'Cuda, and at least two "Plum Crazy" Dodge Challengers were on display as well. Lots of items, from chicken dinners to buckets of car washing products, were raffled off during the show. There was also music, with dancing, and of course, food!

The third agency to benefit from fundraising by our Lakewood Ranch Knights is the My Choice Pregnancy Center in Sarasota, a resource for women who find themselves with an unplanned pregnancy. This facility provides pregnancy tests, relationship counseling, and education in birthing, pregnancy, parenting, and adoption. They also provide maternity clothing, formula, diapers, baby furniture, etc., for women who may not be able to afford these items. The Center has a thrift shop attached to its center, but more funds are always needed.

So, what did our Knights do to help? They held an event billed as "Knight Fever – the Laps for Life Ball," in cooperation with Sarasota Knights Council #3358, at the Knights of Columbus Hall on Fruitville Road. This semi-formal event included a few words from attendee Bishop Frank Dewane of the Diocese of Venice, who gave high praise to the contribution of our Lakewood Ranch Knights. "Everybody is finding out who these guys are!" Dewane said.

The ball featured a DJ, a silent auction, lots of food, and lots of fun. The auction items ranged from wine baskets to a set of garden tools, and from a pet basket to paintings by local artists. After ticket sales and proceeds from the auction, the Laps for Life Ball raised \$8,000 for My Choice.

What else are these guys working on? Never stopping their charitable work, as if these three activities weren't enough, the Lakewood Ranch Knights have also raised money to help fund a mobile medical care van, which has already been custom-built, and which will be dedicated and put into service later this year.


So, our Lakewood Ranch Knights continue to contribute to the community, continuing the tradition of service started by their founder, Father Michael McGivney, over a hundred years ago.


