





FIRST ACT

The new Players Centre for Performing Arts might be officially on the Waterside Place map, but the construction of the 4.5-acre campus won't break ground until spring 2021. According to Kirk Boylston, as contractor Willis Smith wraps up the main Waterside Place buildings, it will shift resources toward the construction of the new theater campus, which currently calls for a 480-seat main stage auditorium, 125-seat black box theater, a 100-seat cabaret theater and The Arnold Simonsen Players Studio, home of the organization's education programming. In the meantime, the organization continues fundraising through its Centre Stage Campaign, steadily climbing toward the \$50 million needed to complete the project and programming.

"Our first goal is to hit the \$16 million to \$18 million mark in the next year, so we can start to build," says Jeffery Kin, interim CEO and managing artistic director. "Once we start digging, we plan to go full speed ahead."

Solid fiscal footing, Kin says, is an integral part of the plan. The additional \$33 million to \$35 million of the campaign raised throughout construction will support future programming.

"We want to make sure the organization is strong and steady, so it can thrive," Kin says.

In its 90th season, the theater is asking for steadfast support from the community throughout its transition to Lakewood Ranch. The Players sold its downtown Sarasota building to fund research, design and a portion of the new construction, but it will remain at that location through April 2021. Supporters wanting to leave a lasting mark on the expansion can still do so via major donations, which include building naming opportunities.

"These can be true legacy gifts," says Kin. "We plan to be there for at least another 90 years."

Kin says with the move to Waterside Place, it will broaden the theater's reach north and south to engage a much larger community.

"We're excited to be able to share what's to come and will be available for all of Sarasota and beyond," he says. "This little community theater will become an epicenter for the arts." Continued from Page 32

When you are interested in buying a home or moving to Lakewood Ranch, with all it has to offer, it could easily become downright overwhelming. The information center team, which also includes Greg Spring and host of guides, was created to facilitate comfort and clarity, which it has done for years. Now these tours offer a way to streamline the process and help more people.

"We drove around here once before, six or eight months ago, and we kind of got lost," says Mike Mullaly from Chicago, who's on the tour with his wife, Barb. "We went and looked at a specific home that was for sale. It was nice, but I had no idea what all was available here and how big this place is."

When it comes to home sales, the tours are clearly an asset.

"We've had tremendous success in the short time that we've had our bus," Verdel says after the tour. And although he could not offer hard numbers, he referenced a lady who had taken the tour two weeks prior and was buying in Waterside.

As we set off on the last hour of our tour after a quick pit stop at James L. Patton park, there are questions from the rows about flood zones, taxes, neighborhood security and state roads. Verdel answers each question while continuing to offer points most would put in the "plus" column: centralized mailboxes to promote community interaction and underground power lines that are aesthetically pleasing and hold up better in inclement weather. And, of course, that Lakewood Ranch has its own post office.

On the way back to the visitor center, Verdel highlights points of interest, such as doctors' offices, grocery plazas and even a local brewery and distillery. Some passengers are vocal with their "Ah-ha, that's where that is" moments, while others furiously write notes on out the ones that didn't make the cut. the villages that piqued their interest — and heed Verdel's advice to cross of people from all over," Verdel says.

THE WHEELS ON THE BUS

Although the bus was purchased to host the LWR community tours, which had become wildly popular, the Lakewood Ranch Communities team didn't want it to sit idle between tours.

"Collectively, we came together to figure out how best to use it," says Monaca Onstad, the director of community relations for Lakewood Ranch Communities.

Idle it is not. The bus is now being used to go beyond The Ranch, hosting regular regional destination trips and tours.

"Maybe you just moved here," Onstad says. "It becomes an opportunity to take you somewhere you have never been. You just get on the bus, and you are there. It's all planned for you."



Lakewood Ranch residents take multigeneration to the next level by raising puppies bound for important guide dog work across the country.

hen 11-week-old yellow lab Liberty entered Lakewood Ranch resident Gina Hagopian's home in October, the pup stole her heart. Hardly straying from Hagopian's side since, Liberty has accompanied her to grocery stores, restaurants and even brunch. Although the pair's story has a happy ending, it is not traditional. Hagopian is a puppy raiser for Southeastern Guide Dogs (SEGD); Liberty my pet," says Hagopian, who also has is her first puppy-in-training, or PIT. a 1-year-old Airedale terrier named When Liberty turns a year old, she'll return to the SEGD campus to prepare

As a top-notch guide dog program, beyond stellar genetics and professional training, a SEGD puppy's care is an essential part of the organization's end goal. PITs are destined to become part of a symbiotic team, their ultimate counterpart a seeing-impaired individual, a veteran or possibly a child on the autism spectrum. Puppy raisers know this from the outset.

That person will decide if he or she wants to keep in contact with a puppy raiser from there.

"Our organization has a lifetime commitment to any team that we put out," Shepherd says. "We have alumni advisers that visit teams every year, and we can give puppy raisers an update even if they can't have contact."

About 70% of puppies find a career with SEGD, but the 30% that don't go on to loving homes, and raisers have the first option to adopt them.

In addition to the longer-term commitment of raising, there are other opportunities. Puppy starters are needed when a puppy is ready but there is not a raiser ready just yet. Puppy sitters help with a puppy for two to three weeks. Finishers are needed when a raiser endures an unexpected life change and cannot complete the raising.

"We have something for everyone," Shepard says. "It truly is altruism at its best. Our raisers give so much, but then they tell us what they have received."

CANIPET YOUR PUPPY?

When you see a dog with its guide dog coat on, it is generally not OK to engage. But pups-in-training are eager to receive a stranger's attention, and it is warmly welcomed up until about 10 months old.

"We want them to be socialized not only to the environment but also to people when they are young," says Leslie Shepard, of Southeastern Guide Dogs. "We want the puppy to learn self-control when they greet people, so it's great practice."

Rock of Ages

Forget going quietly into retirement. The members of Lakewood Ranch's Blue Pelicans are ready to rock their golden years.

t's a beautiful January afternoon in Lakewood Ranch, and Van Morrison's "Wild Night" is pumping out of the sunny clubhouse just past the open gates of Indigo. Behind the mic, a 60-something sporting a trim white beard and Woodstock tee belts out the lyrics, which unspool before him on an iPad.

"The wild night is calling / C'mon out and dance," he sings, as the drummer pounds out the rhythm below a familiar jangle of twin guitars, keyboards and soaring sax.

It's been said that you have to put off being young until after retirement, a point well illustrated by the members of The Blue Pelicans. As Lakewood Ranch's rising troubadours of feel-good classic rock, these five retirees — all expats from the corporate world — have managed to pull off the ultimate second act: starting a rock band after 50.

They did this by mixing good oldfashioned work ethics with boyish exuberance and just the right amount of devil-may-care confidence to crush Chuck Berry's "Johnny B. Goode" in front of a bar crowd.

In just three years, The Blue Pelicans (Ken Combs, Bill Irvan and Tom Perillo on guitar and vocals; Bob Sharak on keys; and Anil Warrier on drums) have cultivated a loyal following around a crisp sound and crowd-pleasing lineup of The Beatles, Eagles and Van Morrison hits. Maybe you've caught one of their gigs. They regularly play private parties and barbecues around town, in addition to the Naughty Monk, where last August they threw down a threehour Woodstock set in front of nearly 150 people in honor of the festival's 50th anniversary.

"People showed up in their tie-dyed shirts and all their peace, love and music paraphernalia," Irvan says. "That was a rush."

LIVING ROOM ROOTS

The Pelicans began in typical Lakewood Ranch fashion: with a sign posted to a community bulletin board.

Perillo, 60, was the first to make a move. A native New Yorker, the hobby guitarist spent 25 years managing financial systems for Barnes & Noble before retiring to Indigo four years ago. Hoping to snag a few jam buddies, he hung a "Musicians Wanted" sign



in the clubhouse by the pool, which grabbed the attention of Combs, a retired Sarasota CFO who briefly played with a band in Port Charlotte. Irvan entered the picture soon thereafter.

A retired engineer, Irvan, 66, cut his teeth performing John Denver and Jim Croce tunes at coffeehouses when he was a student at the University of Kentucky. Although he sidelined the hobby years ago to focus on his career, he never lost interest in playing — or singing.

"Bill's voice changed things for us," Perillo says. "It pretty much allowed us to do any song we wanted at that point."

With permission from the community, they moved their jam sessions out of Combs' living room and into Indigo's clubhouse, to the delight of nearby poolgoers.

When Warrier moved into the neighborhood in 2017, he couldn't help but notice the group was missing a drummer. A musical neophyte, the 59-year-old had never even considered playing the drums during his 32 years working in supply chain management at Colgate-Palmolive. After listening to Perillo, Combs and Irvan each week, however, the new retiree decided to make a bold move. He signed up for lessons to become the band's drummer.

"The first lesson I took, I said, 'There's no way I'm doing this," Warrier recalls. "My teacher (Garrett Dawson at The Drum Studio) said, 'No, you can do it,' and he got me going."

What kept him going was watching Perillo, Combs and Irvan rock out. Novice or not, he wanted in.

"The end of the story is Anil's really good!" Perillo says with a laugh. "He's been a real surprise."

The band started gigging as a fourpiece on New Year's Eve 2017 with Warrier on his old electronic drum kit. A few months later, the group met Sharak, a longtime Lakewood Ranch resident and regular at Lakewood Ranch Town Hall's Pro-Jam sessions.

"I played a couple of songs, did an audition," Sharak says. "They liked the way I played the solos to all The Beatles songs, and that was it."

Of all the Pelicans, Sharak has the wildest backstory. The 72-year-old army veteran-turned-CPA played the accordion as a child. By 10th grade, he



was in a wedding band and by college a nine-piece soul band. Sharak even played bass guitar on a riverboat in Pittsburgh before pushing aside music for a 32-year career as a financial executive at Johnson & Johnson.

"I said to myself, 'I have to earn some money,' and music wasn't the way I was going to do it," says Sharak, whose first Pelicans gig was in mid-2018. "Thirtytwo years later, I'm done with the corporate world and getting back into music."

FULL BAND RISING

The Pelicans are as polished and harmonious as any seasoned cover band. They rock and roll without overwhelming the listener or grating on the ears. Their sound is tight, and their love of playing is palpable. In fact, the group vibes so well together that people assume they're listening to a veteran ensemble.

"I don't know of any other community in Lakewood Ranch that has a band," says Indigo Lifestyle Director Tami Prince, whose office is located in the clubhouse where the band rehearses each week. "I've heard them play the same songs over and over, and they just keep getting better and better. It's created a really cool atmosphere at Indigo. Residents will come to the pool just to hear them practice. I see people dancing and singing along. It's exciting."

One of the band's favorite local singalongs is its monthly happy hour slot at The Sheridan at Lakewood Ranch. "It's a little bit of giving back to the community," Irvan says. "You can tell [the residents] are having a blast, which makes it even more fun."

Fun is a word that comes up often when talking to the Pelicans. It's like the old Dick Van Dyke quote: "Retirement means doing what you have fun doing," a tag line that could double as the motto for the band.

Perillo says that forming a band as older, wiser guys has worked to their advantage. There's less squabbling. More compromise. A better understanding of not having everything go your way. And best of all, larger chunks of free time.

"There isn't a better hobby when you retire than getting together with other guys and playing music," Combs says. "That's the best retirement thing you could ever do, I think."

Sharak agrees — with one caveat. "As long as it doesn't become a job," he says with a chuckle.



they found a new port of harbor. A little town called Hunter's Point on the west coast of Florida.

The new site was sheltered by barrier islands — but not bottled up. Nearby passes offered access to north Sarasota Bay, Tampa Bay and the Gulf of Mexico. And more fish than anyone could count. The world was hungry. The seafaring settlers were happy to meet the need.

The fishermen got back to work. They barely noticed when the U.S. Post Office arrived in 1896. After consulting with bigwigs, they gave the settlement an official name: Cortez. Once the fishermen noticed, a few were less than pleased. Some of their descendants still are, including historian, author and activist Mary Fulford Green, a granddaughter of the first residents of the village. She's also the co-author of "Cortez: Then and Now."

"We should never have chosen that name," Green says. "Cortez was an evil man, and that's not who we are."

But most of the fishermen shrugged it off. New name, same attitude. The sons and grandsons of the original settlers kept fishing. Life was good. Except when it wasn't.

The barrier islands didn't stop the hurricane of 1921. Its 100-mph winds trashed the village. But the fishermen weren't going anywhere. Neither were the fish. Why should they?

They rebuilt and resumed fishing — even in hard times. Why?

"You can call us stubborn or crazy," laughs Karen Bell, a third-generation Cortez native and the owner of Star Fish Restaurant and the A.P. Bell Fish Co. "Maybe a little of both."

That true grit paid off.

During the Great Depression, Cortez was one of the few American communities that scorned federal aid. Its fishermen still went out to sea, even when Florida farmers couldn't pay for their catch. No money? No problem. They traded fish for fresh produce — and nobody starved.

That way of life endured. Tropical depressions and economic depressions didn't stop them. Politics almost did. In 1994, Florida voters approved a gill net ban, and it became law in 1995. The hard work of commercial fishing

just got a lot harder.

"The net ban is a bad law based on a lie," Green recalls. "The amendment supporters accused us of making a 'mullet stink.' They called us 'the vacuum cleaners of the sea.' There wasn't one word of truth in it. We could never have caught all the fish in the water. But Florida voters bought the lie, and our fishermen had to adapt."


They did just that. Most of them,

Cortez's die-hard fishermen went farther out in the Gulf and worked longer hours. But some hung up their nets for good. Others turned to drug running. Today, those outlaws are long gone. The village's law-abiding fishing families remain. If you know Cortez, you'll know their names.

The Guthries, the Bells, the Taylors and the Fulfords — to name a few.

Tough people. When life knocks them down, they get back up. They've bounced back from a long list of threats,



Bell, the answer is simple: because it's a real community, not an artificial construct. Because Cortez has something to fight for.

"What we have here is more than buildings," Bell says. "Cortez is a real fishing village. Our families might feud occasionally. But we have each other, and that's why we're still here. We're here to stay — even if we have to fight."

What will Cortez village look like 25 years in the future? Without a time machine, we can't answer. We can report it's still a great place to be.

THE NEWS FROM CORTEZ

Cortez's fishing industry still thrives. A.P. Bell Fish Co. is still going strong, and the fishing boats aren't props. But most of today's fishermen are either commuters or renters. Out on the bay, the scores of picturesque stilt houses are down to three. On land, the cracker cottages get neater and prettier every year. Cortez's core families still own most of the cottages. Most families don't make a living from the sea, either. Hungry, sleepy tourists are the new catch of the day.

According to Bell, that's life. And life is change. Adapting to change is the secret. This village of survivors is good at many things. That's one of them.

Cortezians might cherish the past, but they don't live in it.

"We're resilient, and we go with the flow," Bell says. "Hey, if we survived the net ban, we can deal with anything. A lot of people are up in arms, but I'm not worried about the bridge; I'm not worried about gentrification. Whatever happens, we'll think of something."





ost homeowners in the ultra-deluxe Lake
Club of Lakewood Ranch know their way
around real estate. Chances are they've
built, bought and sold many high-end homes
over the years. Take Donnie and Debbie
Thompson. They've built homes in South
Carolina, where they live half the year, and
when they started spending time in Florida,
they built a house in The Lake Club.

As nice as it was, it was still a builder's model. It was a house they had to fit into, not a house that fit them. They knew they could do better. That's when they discovered Sarasota architect Clifford Scholz and set into motion the creation of a new house, one of the most distinctive in the Ranch.

"We were looking for an architect, doing research, looking online," Donnie explains. "We knew Cliff was the one."

Scholz, one of Florida's most prominent architects, is renowned for his classic style. It follows the principles of great architecture, particularly the Palladian and Georgian periods, and updates them for the way people live today. Yet it never forgets the proper scale and attention to detail that ultimately make a home exciting. Scholz's most famous work is the trio of waterfront homes he designed for fashion designer Adrienne Vittidini on Lido Key.

The Thompsons' home is Scholz's first in the Ranch. At first glance it blends quite well with its neighbors. But look carefully, and the art emerges.

It's British West Indian in style, a timeless look that also happens to be the latest thing. The Mediterranean decor of the Ranch is quickly being replaced by a much lighter look, and the Thompson house is at the peak of this trend.

The Thompsons were lucky to find the perfect lot. It's a good size — about two-thirds of an acre — and faces a nature preserve on one side, with water views from practically all of the major rooms.

The home breaks a couple rules. You enter into a great room, with an adjacent open kitchen. There is no formal living room, no formal dining room. There is a single dining area that is part of the kitchen (though there is stool seating at one of two kitchen islands). The effect is one of open space and tropical sun streaming in.

One of Scholz's trademarks is his impressive



ceilings. Look up in almost any room, and you are in for a treat. You'll see coffers and trays and beams and paneling. Each has its own unique character and scale, its own degree of formality or informality.

In the Thompson house, informality usually wins. It's a barefoot kind of house, with room after room of beautiful wood floors. Yet it's designed to follow the tenets of classical architecture. The three arched windows that look out on the pool are a time-honored motif of Palladian architecture.

Both of the Thompsons cook, with Donnie turning out the Cajun recipes he learned from his mother in Louisiana. The couple's kitchen is an understated workspace, with the cabinetry, some of it with glass doors for display, set slightly raised above the floor like furniture. There's a triple sink, plus another prep sink, and an office area is right around the corner.

The master wing can be found at the opposite side of the house. Here things get a little

more formal — and elegant. The beautifully proportioned bedroom has 12-foot ceilings with carefully detailed trim and 9-inch baseboards. There's even a little velvet bed for Oliver, the 15-year-old, long-haired dachshund that greets you at the front door. The master bath is suitably grand and continues the muted color scheme that takes its inspiration from the colors seen just outside the window — the sages and muted greens, the sands and shell colors, the occasional pop of something bright.

Near the bedroom is an exercise room with a mirrored wall and an office for Donnie, which he admits doesn't get much use since he sold his company — he manufactured and distributed industrial film — and retired several years ago. (Debbie used to teach fourth grade.)

Guests have several options at the Thompson home. Up a stairway in the entrance hall are two more bedrooms. But the guest room of choice is definitely the "casita." Tucked away off the elaborate outdoor living area, it's a self-contained suite, with bath and small kitchen.

"We designed this house for the way we live," Debbie says, and she credits decorator Holly






BRUNCH IT UP
