



Better with Bacon

Breakfast and brunch is a tasty, and big, business. A national leader in the industry has called the region home for nearly 35 years — and now it's growing at a rapid-fire rate.

'n national restaurant circles, First Watch is a rock star. The latest accolade: Nation's Restaurant News named the company — credited with popularizing the concept of being open only for breakfast and lunch — the second-fastest growing restaurant chain nationwide, ranked by sales growth. The top 10 includes Chick-fil-A, Tropical Smoothie Café and the No. 1 chain, Shake Shack. First Watch grew sales 48.55% in 2019, from \$354 million in 2018 to \$525.8 million.

More praise: In a survey from employee engagement company Glassdoor, First Watch made the top 10 among all brands nationally in three categories: percentage of employees who would recommend their job to a friend, percentage of employees with a positive business outlook and CEO approval ratings.

Yet First Watch, on a corporate level at least, is often anonymous in its hometown — east Manatee County.

Now in a headquarters in a University Park office complex, off Cooper Creek Boulevard, First Watch was previously located in an office in a Lakewood Ranch corporate park. It's been based in the area since 1986, soon after co-founders Ken Penderv and John Sullivan opened the first First Watch, in California, in 1983. Some 150 people work in the corporate office,

"I meet people around here all the time who have no idea how big we are or that we even have our headquarters here," says First Watch President and CEO Chris Tomasso, a Sarasota native who has been with the company since 2006. That's not necessarily a bad thing, Tomasso adds, given the company's ethos aren't flashy but instead based on the golden rule principle and the motto "You first."

First Watch is on the cusp of getting more local notoriety with a new headquarters project. Under construction now behind its current space, the company's new home office is planned as a two-story, 39,000-square-foot complex. It will include a workout center with locker rooms, a test kitchen and classroom facilities for the company's management center. The company, Tomasso says, is planning to move into it at the end of the year, and the entire project "further entrenches us in the market here."

Company officials also say the project will lead to at least 85 new jobs, with an expected average annual salary of \$82,000. 





Five projects Hunsicker is most proud of:

1982

Hunsicker acted as the Manatee County Commission's liaison during the county's court case against the Army Corps of Engineers and Environmental Protection Agency to change the location of ocean dumping of toxic dredge spoils in the Gulf of Mexico. Manatee County objected to the existing offshore site 9.5 miles off Anna Maria Island, and the court ordered the EPA to find an alternative ocean disposal site approximately 27 miles offshore. The case helped develop a new federal policy for future ocean dumping.

1986 and 1988

The County Commission requested voter approval by referendum ballot to purchase lands vacated by the Becker Phosphate Corp. and the negotiated purchase from W.R. Grace Phosphates and Estech Chemical Cos. After a voter education effort led by Hunsicker and several other staff members, the referendum overwhelmingly passed to acquire more than 21,000 acres upstream of Lake Manatee, the county's drinking water source.

1985-1987


Hunsicker served as the lead project manager for the Manatee County Utility System to secure \$51.2 million in federal aid with EPA grants, along with addition of approximately \$10 million in federal aid added through 1989 to create wastewater collection systems for south and north county homes. These grants increased wastewater treatment capacity to allow for future growth and protect the environment by taking 20,000 septic systems offline.

1984-2011

Hunsicker secured government funding to construct the Wares Creek Stormwater Improvement Project, which, at more than \$50 million, represents the largest federal, state and local investment for stormwater improvement in Manatee County's history.

1996-present

Hunsicker led initiatives to successfully obtain protection of an additional 6,000 acres of environmentally sensitive lands otherwise slated for development. He then led the management and reconstruction of land at 12 locations along Manatee County coastline and interior, the most significant of which encompass Emerson Point, Robinson Preserve, Perico Preserve and Neal Preserve.

ing by the seat of your pants the last two-and-a-half months of the 2019-20 school year? Let's not do that again. Lean on other parents, combining affinities in certain subjects or backgrounds in education/psychology to help your children succeed. You're not a teacher for a reason, so don't be shy asking for help.

- **Digital tutoring:** Have an older child struggling with a specific subject? A defiant kindergartner who just doesn't seem to connect with material? Search any of the parent groups on Facebook, and you'll find a plethora of recommendations for tutoring. The online platform Care.com also has a dedicated division for tutoring where you can find the perfect local fit for your family.
- **Socialization:** You might be stuck inside with the kids, distanced for protection and inevitably losing your mind a little. Get creative! Have a FaceTime Lego-building play date with a friend, go on a socially distanced nature scavenger hunt at a local park with the neighbor kids, or hold group Zoom calls with classmates to normalize the at-home feel.
- Creative classroom: Kids find it challenging enough to sit still at a desk during "live" instruction, so asking them to stay engaged watching a glorified Zoom conference call for hours poses a whole new challenge. Change up where they sit for class time — let them lie on a bean bag chair, stand to watch (putting their device on a counter) or blow up an exercise ball to allow for some wiggling while watching.




