





# FOR STARTERS

K-8 SCHOOL TAKES SHAPE

To ease the squeeze of congestion in Lakewood Ranch area schools, construction is expected to begin on a new K-8 school in January.

HKS Architects and Williamson Design Associates recently released designs for the school, which will be built on 40 acres off Uihlein Road.

The school's planned to have a capacity of 1,692 students. The first phase of the project, the two-story elementary building, is scheduled to be complete in time for the 2025-26 school year. Plans also include an administration building and media center as well as dining, music and arts facilities. A one-story middle school building is scheduled to be complete in January 2026.

All that comes at a price tag of about \$82 million.





#### **PAVILION TO REBUILD**

After some spent July Fourth fireworks were placed in a garbage can with the best of intentions, the Greenbrook Adventure Park pavilion accidentally caught fire and was destroyed.

Since then, the structure, which included a picnic area, has been demol-

ished with a vacant cement pad awaiting construction of its replacement.

That, neighbors are happy to hear, could take place as early as July. The replacement pavilion will cost between \$100,000 and \$150,000.

But we'll all make sure to take the impromptu fireworks show somewhere else in the future.

# A Few Doors Apart

Samantha Albano and Gabriella Moss met in high school. But they reignited their friendship 10 years later through their businesses in San Marco Plaza.

t's been a decade since Gabriella Costa and Samantha Albano shared similar goals at The Outof-Door Academy in Lakewood Ranch.

During their junior and senior years at the private school, they both played on the volleyball team — both exceedingly driven to succeed, both team cocaptains.

And though they took different paths after graduating from high school in 2013, they recently landed about the length of 10 volleyball nets away from each other in Lakewood Ranch's San

Marco Plaza as young business owners.

But, before launching into descriptions of their past, present and future, both women wanted to talk about their identities, in terms of their names.

Costa is now Gabriella Moss, after marrying her husband, Greg Moss, in April. She stresses that her concern was about her first name and not her married name. The Moss part was an easy transition for her. Her concern was getting people to know her as "Gabriella," and not "Gabby," as she used to be known. She sees Gabriella as perfect for her ownership of the Via La Casa coffee shop, wine bar and art gallery. It's, well, elegant.

Likewise, Albano wants to turn the page toward the name on her birth certificate as she builds Purify, an Urban Sweat Lodge, toward being a brand throughout Florida, and perhaps the nation. While she has not married — "I'm married to my business," she says — she has outgrown what people used to call her — "Sam."

First names aside, along with being entrepreneurs and attending the same high school, the two women don't have a lot of similarities.

Moss was a 6-foot middle blocker at ODA who joined the program when

she was a junior. Albano was a 5-foot-6 libero who had come up through ODA's system since sixth grade.

"I was driven, focused in high school," Moss says. "But I didn't figure out female friendships in high school. I wish I had that perspective. I didn't keep any high school friends."

Albano says Moss doesn't need to feel bad about having little time in high school to develop relationships. "She was super sweet, smart and she worked hard," Albano says. "I didn't have a lot of free time, either."

When Moss headed to the University of Florida, Albano flew to Merrimack College in North Andover, Massachusetts, a suburb of Boston. Like Moss, she says ODA was crucial in moving her forward toward her career goals.

"I have to give some credit to ODA, because they equip you," Albano says. "College was super easy for me because of ODA."

Albano graduated from Merrimack in four years while Moss earned a degree from the University of Florida in five. Albano received her degree in business marketing while Moss earned a material sciences engineering degree.

Both began tinkering with various jobs after college to search for what suited them best. Albano opened her first Purify business in 2018 in downtown Sarasota and then relocated it to San Marco Plaza in March 2023 — right after Moss had opened Via La Casa in February.

Moss says they both benefited from parents who care.

"We are super privileged," Moss said. "We couldn't be here without our parents."

Moss's parents, Paolo Costa and Silvia Teixeira Costa, have lived in The River Club since 2008.

"My parents are entrepreneurs," says Moss, who splits ownership of the business with her mother. "I have always been inspired by them. My entire life, I've learned that being your own boss marks success in life. My mom is an artist. So, Via La Casa started as an art gallery. Then my mom said, 'If you are going to have a bar, you should put wine in.' The original idea was more sip and shop ... Browse with a drink. It would be something unique and special."

Via La Casa is a mix of serenity and beauty.

Albano says she experienced some business struggles early with Purify, but quickly has come to the point where she has sold one franchise, is close to selling another and sees continued expansion as part of her future.

That makes her smile because she remembers the days after first opening when she listened to people passing in front of her business.

"There was a lot of educating, explaining to do," she says. "I could hear people scoffing, 'They won't make it two weeks."

But five years later she continues to grow. Like Moss, Albano says her parents, Country Club's Sandy and Mike Albano, have been key to her development. Right out of college, she was experiencing allergy problems and her parents insisted she move back to the Lakewood Ranch area so they could help her. In trying to solve her allergy woes, she came upon the combination of light and heat in a far-infrared session that had powerful healing effects.

Her research indicated that people could sweat out heavy metals, toxins and pathogens. Her business is formed on the premise that sweating is a highly effective means of eliminating toxins and that the far-infrared body wrap sauna promotes the elimination of toxins.

What happens during a session?

"I call it an elevated sauna experience without the direct heat," says Albano. "The client rests on a Tempur-Pedic bed and watches Netflix or meditates or listens to podcasts over a period of 50 minutes. It can be a very healing experience."

Both Albano and Moss have great expectations for the future of their businesses. But they also know it will take time.

"You don't (have success) in a day," Albano says. "Unless you are a celebrity, you will be grinding, wondering."



## Healthcare Heroes

Nurses are a critical part of our healthcare system. But studies show there will be a significant shortage of nurses in Florida by 2035. Here's how some regional schools are addressing it.

olly Johnson, a licensed practical nursing program instructor at Manatee Technical College, enlists student Michael Baez's help with demonstrating how to properly move a patient on a bed. Using a mannequin that represents a patient, Johnson carefully explains every move to a group of intent students. Meanwhile, other LPN students, including Anabel Martinez and Breann Marshall, practice taking each other's vitals.

These hands-on activities are just one way MTC is ensuring these students are ready for a nursing career upon graduation.

And there couldn't be a better time to consider a career in nursing.

Hospitals around the state — and the country — are experiencing critical staffing shortages. The Florida Hospital Association estimates that, by 2035, Florida will face a shortage of more than 55,000 nurses. There's the perfect storm of reasons why, including the CO-VID-19 pandemic and subsequent employee burnout, a rapidly aging population, lack of qualified educators and programs, and high turnover.

Regional educational institutions, including MTC; State College of Florida, Manatee-Sarasota; and Arizona College, have heard the message loud and clear — and are addressing the problem by offering creative strategies and programs that are more accessible to nursing student candidates.

"Being able to provide the education to make sure we have safe, competent nurses going out into the field is extremely important or else we're not going to have the means to take care of our people who are sick and in need," says Dayna Grella, the nursing program director at MTC, which offers programs for students to become licensed practical nurses, nursing as-

sistants and patient care technicians.

Alexis Garruzzo, the executive director of academic operations at Arizona College of Nursing's Sarasota campus, says the college was deliberate in its choice to have a Sarasota campus, which is located off University Parkway.

"We look at what the number of job opportunities in the nursing profession are in a market and then we look at the number of qualified nurses in the area," Garruzzo says. "The Gulf Coast area as a whole has a pretty severe shortage. We decided to target that market."

Arizona College of Nursing exclusively provides a Bachelor of Science in

nursing that can be completed in three years. Its Sarasota campus opened in August 2022. The college will produce its first graduates in spring 2025.

State College of Florida offers an associate degree in nursing, a licensed practical nursing program, a registered nurse program and a bachelor's degree in nursing. Starting in August, SCF was able to increase the number of students the college could accept in its nursing programs as a result of \$1.1 million raised through community partnerships and a match from the state Legislature.



"One of my personal goals was to find a way to double the number of nurses we can take in our programs," says Carol Probstfeld, the president of SCF. "When I started here, we were at about 180 students per year. I'm happy to say this fall we have 366 students who have identified as being part of our nursing program." SCF is also expanding to offer its nursing programs at its campus being built in Parrish.

Every nursing student at Arizona College of Nursing, MTC and SCF participates in clinicals at medical facilities throughout Manatee and Sarasota counties to obtain real-world experiences.

The three educational institutions ensure the students work in a variety of medical facilities, including hospitals, nursing homes, hospice centers, mental health facilities and pediatricians' offices. This gives students an opportunity to see where they would like to work after they graduate and in what they might like to specialize.

"It helps a student take the content they're learning from the classroom and put real-life application to it so they understand this is the environment they could expect and see what's a good fit for them before they make a permanent career choice," Garruzzo says.

A challenge can be finding clinical placements.

"We have other schools in the area, so everybody's kind of competing for that clinical space," Grella explains. "There's just not enough clinical space to go around to be able to expand as much as I think all of us would like to expand."

Besides clinicals, another hands-on learning opportunity comes from the simulation labs at each college. All of them have CAE high-fidelity "manikins" that mimic body functions and provide students with an opportunity to practice clinical skills without the risk of patient harm.

"Not only do we have the technology, but we have all the scenarios that our top-notch faculty has created so they can set up just about anything they want to," Probstfeld says. "It gives them a safe environment where, if they make mistakes, it's not going to be lifethreatening. It gives them confidence. Once they've been able to do it in that environment, it's not new to them when they're in a live environment."

SCF also brings actors into the simulation labs to act as family members so students can learn how to interact with them in various situations.

Grella, Garruzzo and Probstfeld say many of the graduates from these programs remain local because they have ties to the community.

"When you have somebody who's working in a community where they live, they have a personal connection," Probstfeld says. "That's one of the hard parts about the cost of housing. When you have law enforcement officers, teachers or nurses who can't live

in the community they work in, they don't have the same level of personal connection. It's imperative we have as many people working in this field as we possibly can who are from here. Then they can be part of the fabric of the community."

To get more nurses into the field sooner, MTC is starting a licensed practical nursing program open to all juniors in Manatee County high schools.

It's scheduled to start in January with 12 students.

rowing up in Rising Sun, Ohio, Mark Hiser spent every day around horses.

His family had more than 100 horses and, from a young age, he was riding and competing in horse shows. He has spent most of his life caring for and training horses, which has led to success at horse shows all over the country. In 2019, Hiser started center-

What makes the connection between a person and a horse so special?

I've seen people in the worst situations in their life helped by a horse. I met a guy in Oklahoma who is autistic and tried to commit suicide two or three times. He flat out said the only thing that saved his life were horses. He's riding Western dressage and competing at the world level now. I think (horses) touch everyone in different ways. People always stop and wave when they see a horse. I think horses just have that "come pat me" energy.

Does riding therapy also benefit horses?


I think horses know when they've done something good. They want to do what you want them to do. If you have inexperienced people around a horse, the horse is going to try to teach them. The more the rider is up on the horse, the more the horse remembers that rider. The horses know that they did their job. There are people who say horses can't talk, but look at their eyes and they'll tell you if they're happy or not.

What are some new initiatives you want to bring to SMART?

I want to create skill-building programs and classes for business groups, schools, the YMCA, the Boys and Girls Club and others. It brings recognition to what we're doing and the horses like the interaction and attention. Something I really want to bring in are horse shows. We'd provide opportunities for our clients to compete. I'd also like to open an obstacle course to the public.

What are the top three items on your wish list for 2024?

I don't want to leave a veteran or a kid who comes to us behind. I want to make sure that every one of them is included in our programs. That's my No. I goal right off the bat. I also want more volunteers and to be able to offer them educational opportunities. And I want everyone to know who we are. If they know who we are, then we're doing our job. I want them to meet the horses and see the facility and also have fun events out here. It's not always about the horses. Sometimes it's just about the gathering.

Where do you see SMART in 10 years? I have big visions and I think big. My dad and my grandpa always told me, "Don't ever let anyone stand in front of your vision." If you don't dream big, how do you get there? I'd love to have at least three more SMARTs running in Florida so we can keep going with these veterans and the kids and adults and grow, grow, grow."



designed to expand opportunities for underserved and at-risk children who otherwise could not afford to participate in swim lesson programs. Barringhaus also serves a variety of other students of all ages through her School of Fish curriculum.

"We teach people with special needs, including people who are non-verbal, hearing impaired, and those with various learning and physical abilities," Barringhaus explains. "We use the medium of water to help people recover from strokes, brain trauma and other sports-related injuries."

In addition, Barringhaus helps people conquer aquaphobia (fear of water). She uses training from her master's degree in industrial organizational psychology to gently guide people past their swimming anxiety.

"Teaching aquaphobic individuals requires a lot of patience and being a good listener. The process creates a lot of anxiety, panic and pure fear that each individual has to overcome," Barringhaus says. "Each circumstance is different, as some people have experienced a near-drowning incident, some have been caught in a riptide in the ocean, and some just have a fear of the water without incident. Each lesson is customized to fit the needs of each person and their situation."

Barringhaus is highly invested in every one of her students, monitoring their week-to-week progress and recommending specific actions for improvement. She is sensitive to their needs and customizes her programs to accommodate them.

"Experience allows me to teach from the individual's physical and emotional baseline, respect their vulnerabilities, and quickly earn their trust," Barringhaus says.

This is all possible, Barringhaus says, with the help of her expertly selected group of instructors who receive hours of training to follow her proven methodology. She believes her programs are especially successful because she has created a low studentto-instructor ratio.

"Despite these ingredients, there is no substitute for our passionate and caring instructors who know how to achieve target skills but also respect my customers make when they choose and teach the individual," Barringhaus says. "Each instructor has the expe-

rience to recognize and apply an approach that can be understood and converted into the desired swim outcome."

So far this year, the School of Fish team has brought swimming instruction to more than 300 students at public and private pools and taught upwards of 4,000 lessons.

Beyond School of Fish, Barringhaus stays busy with another independent business called Busy Bee Tutoring, which offers tailored instruction and cognitive learning strategies to children and adults.

"I recognize the trust and sacrifice to engage us for swimming or tutoring services," Barringhaus says.

In and out of the water, Barringhaus propels her students to reach their full potential.

"Teaching swimming is a passion and it is extremely important, especially in Florida, as we are surrounded by water," she says. "I know our students are learning how to swim and how to be safe, but they are also learning lifelong skills that are invaluable. Seeing the excitement from a child or an adult when they master floating, taking a breath, flutter kicking, and being able to get from point A to point B safely is so inspiring."

# What Goes Around

The Lake Club Women's Giving Circle raises valuable funds for regional nonprofits.

Barbara Naimy founded The Lake Club Women's Giving Circle in 2014, the neighborhood had all of 20 homes. Nine years later, there's no easy way to determine the number of rooftops in what is regarded as Lakewood Ranch's most upscale enclave. But TLC Women's' Giving Circle has hard numbers: Its initial roster of 10 has mushroomed to 121.

That's robust growth by any standard.

Despite being based in an exceptionally affluent community, the group's membership has not blossomed because it offers the glitz and glamor of galas, auctions and ball gowns. Quite the contrary. "It's nice to get dressed up and go to a fancy event once in a while," says Jennifer Alokeh, vice-chair. "But our membership much prefers being hands-on. I'd rather volunteer my time doing work than being on a committee picking out a DJ and food for a gala."

For TLC Women's Giving Circle, that means heading to a warehouse and packing 775 grocery bags for Feeding Empty Little Tummies. It means putting stickers on books for a reading day event presented by Embracing Our Differences. It means collecting 438 pairs of sneakers and lots of socks for The Twig. These and other nonprofits have benefited more from the toil of these women than ing events, most notably last year's their money. To be clear, not all of the members turn out for these in-person

activities. Najmy estimates that about two dozen show up on a regular basis.

Of course, raising dollars is involved as well. The group's method is about as basic as it gets: Each member submits a one-time \$1,000 contribution, then \$225 annually. In addition, they pay \$25 a year for the group's administrative costs.

TLC Women's Giving Circle does produce a few smaller fundrais-Lake Club Turkey Trot, which raised \$18,000 for the Food Bank of Manatee.

The sneaker drive brought in \$1,800. Najmy says the Circle also receives contributions from anonymous donors. And from time to time a member will write an unsolicited check for as much as \$5,000 to be put toward the organization's annual grant fund. Other than modest administrative costs, every dollar raised goes to charity. Each December, the Giving Circle chooses an array of local nonprofits to receive its grants, which generally

range from \$1,500 to \$2,500 and do not exceed \$5,000. Past recipients include Manatee Legal Aid, Safe Place and Rape Crisis Center, Still Point Mission and Beyond the Spectrum.

The organization is not its own 501(c)(3) but earns its tax-exempt status under the umbrella of the Manatee Community Foundation.

The Giving Circle's hands-on endeavors are initiated by the members themselves. If one is enthusiastic about a particular nonprofit, she's encouraged to organize the outreach and rally the troops. (And perhaps put together a thank-you lunch afterward.) "As we've evolved, it's rewarding to see that things are happening organically within our group," Najmy says.

Najmy, a real estate agent, and her husband, Joe, a local attorney, have a long history of philanthropy. Last year, the Manatee County Community Foundation honored the couple with its Lifetime Spirit Award. Na-

when she was 5. In 1984, she graduated from Riverview High School. An experience as a student there had a profound impact on her future charitable activities.

"Through high school, I signed up to be a counselor, and my task was to go to Newtown to be a counselor for underprivileged children," she says. "We read with them, took them to the park, spent half-days with them during the summers. It was a real eve-opener — that this was in our backvard."

In 2014, Najmy was sitting in the living room of East County philanthropist Diane Brune when the host started urging her to form a group to become a member of the Founders 50, which dedicates \$50,000 toward regional philanthropy through the Lakewood Ranch Community Fund. The guests hatched the idea of forming The Lake Club Women's Giving Circle. The core group of 10 met for wine and appetizers, formulating a strategy for their new charitable organization. wanted," Najmy says. "We came up with a guidebook of rules, nothing too complicated."

In 2017, the group — then 30 members strong — held its first fundraiser, Wine, Women and Jewels (despite its name, Alokeh assures it was not a gala). The event raised \$13,000 that the Manatee Community Foundation distributed to local charities. COVID-19 put a halt to fundraising, but not to membership. The Lake Club's home sales mushroomed and, from 2020 to 2022, the Giving Circle's membership grew from 30 to 115.

While TLC Women's Giving Circle's identity is not overtly feminist — at least as the term is most understood — its members take pride in their efforts toward female empowerment. Najmy regards the all-women makeup of the group as having "a high level of importance. We pool our minds and passions to go out and touch lives."

Alokeh adds, "To have women leading and running a philanthropic organization like ours, using the power of women to benefit others — it fills my soul."





he looks positively regal, sitting straight-backed atop Cowgirl Tough, one of her eight polo ponies. On a sweltering morning in mid-September, Dr. Margaux Buchanan is clad in the full regalia — a purple jersey with No. 3 on the chest, signifying that she's captain of the Avalon Farms team, a matching helmet strapped snugly on her head, white riding pants, gloves, boots, knee pads. She's out on a field at Sarasota Polo Club, not a patch of shade in sight. If Buchanan is uncomfortably hot, she's not letting on. Her smile says she'd rather be no place else.

The club's polo season is 109 days away, but Buchanan has agreed to stage a brief exhibition with several of her fellow players. Seen from a distance, the eight amateurs — all women — play a spirited contest, but do not appear to go all out, if for no other reason than not to overtax their horses in the suffocating heat. "Eighty percent of the game is the horse," Buchanan says post-match, during which she scored a goal. "Twenty percent is hours and hours of riding and practicing with the mallet."

You might say that Buchanan is in the right line of work. She's a veterinarian — one of five doctors at Sarasota Equine, a practice that specializes in treating horses. Her job mitigates at least some of the expenses incurred from what is a costly pastime. She also provides care for many of the steeds that compete at Sarasota Polo Club.

Buchanan treats horses for colic. gas, dehydration, constipation, fecal impactions and other common ailments. She levels out teeth while the animal is sedated. She gives vaccinations, evaluates horses with a limp, helps mend injuries. She's wanted to be a vet since age 3, says her mother, Jennifer Buchanan, who's chatting with me in the cozy living room of their ranch-style house in Menagerie Farm. Margaux Buchanan bought the 12-acre property in 2021. Mom and daughter and three cats occupy the main house, while 11 horses and one cat reside in the barn.

The star attraction is Safari, a 6-month-old female birthed by Pigpen, a 21-year-old Appaloosa whose polo career is winding down. Frisky and mischievous, and spotted like her mother, Safari is destined to become a polo pony. That's Buchanan's hope, at least. There's no guarantee. "Horses

are built for speed, not contact, so you need a particular type to make a good polo pony," she explains.

# A LOVELY LUNCH AND LIVELY CONVERSATION

After watching Safari frolic with her barn-mates, we return to the house for a buffet lunch that Jennifer has laid out on the kitchen counter. Buchanan's hair is still wet from a shower. A light-blue sundress drapes her lithe, 5-foot-11 frame. She speaks warmly but firmly, her thoughts flowing in a concise narrative.

Eating a salad, Buchanan, 39, explains that she's a "zero goal" player, on a scale that runs from minus-2 to 10 (there are all of six 10-goal players in the U.S.). The rating is based on the number of goals a player is expected to score in a match. "Essentially, I'm supposed to not mess up, and if I score a goal, that's a bonus," she says. "Ninety-five percent of polo players never make it above zero."

As sponsor of the Avalon Farms squad, Buchanan takes the lead in recruiting talent. The four-person, co-ed rosters are fluid from season to season, and combine amateurs and pros. Polo is probably the only sport in the world where a rank amateur can play on a team with a professional. Buchanan, and perhaps a co-sponsor, pays the pros (their earnings are not exorbitant), covers tournament entry fees, which run about \$5,000, and other ad hoc expenses. And then there are dollars laid out to feed her horses; about \$2,000 a month for eight polo ponies. (She uses between five and eight for a match.)

I ask her if she spends about 50 grand a year on polo. "That's a fair assessment," she replies. "I have my ranch and polo. Every single dollar that's not going toward living expenses and retirement goes toward polo." And then she adds with a sly smile, "But it just so happens I know a doctor."

#### A VETERINARY DESTINY, A POLO PASSION

"Mommy, I wanna be a vegetarian."

Jennifer Buchanan laughs as she recalls her daughter's pronouncement at age 3. Little Margaux meant veterinarian, of course. "I was so relieved that I wouldn't have to cook her zucchini for

#### **A POLO PRIMER**

- Polo was first played in Persia (Iran) in 600 B.C.
- In the U.S., polo was first played in New York City in 1877.
- Polo is played on a grass field 300 yards long by 160 yards wide. Nine football fields can fit inside a polo field. (Arena polo is played on a smaller field.)
- A polo goal consists of two vertical posts, eight yards apart, about 10 feet high, with no crossbar or net.
- The modern polo ball is composed of high-impact plastic. It weighs 4.5 ounces and is 3.5 inches in diameter. By comparison, a baseball is 2.86 to 2.94 inches in diameter.
- An official polo match consists of six periods called chukkers seven and a half minutes each, divided by halftime.
- During halftime, spectators are encouraged to walk across the field and stomp down divots.
- Polo teams can consist of men and women, although the higher the level the more apt the teams are to be men- or women-only.
- Players must carry the mallet right-handed for safety reasons.
- Argentina, the U.S. and Europe are the world's polo hotbeds.

the next 15 years," she quips.

Let's pause briefly to reflect on a child staking out a career path two years before entering kindergarten — and then making it so.

Buchanan grew up in the wealthy enclave of Fairfield, Connecticut, the middle child of three. Her father, Ken, was a "financially savvy architect in New York," she says. "We were comfortable, not super-wealthy, but we never wanted for anything." Actually, she did. A horse. "Every Christmas, I begged my dad for one, and the closest I got was a saddle, and that was when I was 16."

She started taking lessons at a local barn at age 5, first cantered during summer camp a year later, then practiced English riding throughout her youth.

Top-notch grades and a college fund set up by her paternal grandmother allowed Buchanan to select from a menu of elite colleges. She chose Smith, a women-only institution in Massachusetts, mostly because of its well-regarded science programs and small class sizes.

Buchanan tried out for the school's English horse-jumping team but didn't make the cut. Instead, she rowed for the crew squad for all four years. During college summers, Buchanan shadowed a veterinarian on Long Island, New York, where she witnessed her first polo match. "I had zero idea of what was going on, other than it was fast and it involved horses," she remembers. "I just knew I was going to do it at some point in my life."

Buchanan studied veterinary medicine at The Ohio State University, which is routinely ranked in the nation's top 5. After earning her degree in 2011, she finally bought her first horse, Babe. The newly minted grad landed an internship in Vero Beach with a vet who had the local polo club as a client. She signed up for lessons. "I hit my first polo ball in the spring of 2012," she says. "I was a good horse rider, but putting a mallet in my hand was the most humbling thing. Still, I was hooked."

Buchanan's veterinary and polo careers took her to California's Central Valley, then back to Massachusetts. ing with cold weather up north. I came down and rented for two months and decided this is where I wanted to be."

"We did a full somersault, I catapulted off her and landed on my back. I can't say that I was in excruciating pain, so I wasn't too alarmed."

Flora was not injured in the fall. Buchanan was transported by ambulance to Sarasota Memorial Hospital. After a battery of tests, for which she declined pain medication, a doctor came in and said that her vertebrae "looked like a bag of ice," she remembers. "I said, 'Okay, we're in trouble. Now give me drugs."

That was on a Friday. Because she was in stable condition, Buchanan had to lie in a hospital bed until the following Monday. On March 1, 2021, she underwent a six-hour surgery that involved fusing seven vertebrae and inserting an 8-inch rod in her back. "I have a big scar right down the middle," she says. "I keep threatening to put a tattoo there, maybe put some hoof prints around it."

Buchanan jumped headlong into an arduous rehab. A friend came and got her horses and took care of them in Ocala. The doctor's orders were not to lift anything heavier than 8 pounds,

so she could only perform certain veterinary tasks. Buchanan says that her colleagues at Sarasota Equine were supportive. Her neurosurgeon's official recommendation? Find another sport.

On Sept. 1, six months to the day after surgery, Buchanan got back on a horse. She concentrated on building core muscles and, with the help of an instructor, reworked her mallet swing to compensate for a diminished ability to twist her torso. The result, she feels, has been an improved overall technique. On Nov. 1, Buchanan was back practicing. She was a go for the season opener.

During our hours together, Buchanan's zeal for polo was on full display. Even so, I asked if she could articulate what the sport means to her.

"Sure," she replied instantly. "I have a high-pressure job caring for people's four-legged family members. It comes with a lot of stress. When I get on a horse for a match, that horse becomes my legs. And then I get to a certain point where all the background noise fades away. There's only that moment, that match, on a horse that I love that's an extension of me."

# Choosing Happiness

Lakewood Ranch's Albert Myara excels at business, but his No. 1 priority is his family.

cabinet maker, Salomon Myara would leave his three-room Paris apartment early each morning and would not return until late in the evening when he would sit down for dinner with his wife, Michelle, and their four children.

By the time dinner was finished, it was time for the kids to go to bed.

Although he was not around for much of his children's formative years, he was antithetical to the notion of an absentee father.

He worked relentlessly so his family could thrive.

At times, the reality was hard to understand for Albert Myara, who lived his first 15 years in Paris before his family moved to Michigan, the home of his mother's sister. When he matured as a teenager and adopted his father's work ethic, he began to understand.

"I played soccer, but he never saw me play," Myara says of his father. "But I realized the reason he worked hard was so we could eat. Mom was affec-

tionate, Dad was tough."

His father continued his work-first mentality in the United States in the 1970s as he went into the antique business. Salomon and Michelle eventually expanded to three stores — Myara's Antiques — and they often enlisted their family members to keep the business running.

"I worked my butt off," says Myara, who early in October was standing in front of a building under construction on Upper Manatee River Road that will become his second Ed's Tavern. The opening is expected to be in December.

As Lakewood Ranch has grown over the last two decades, Myara has had his fingerprints on many business deals, both in real estate and restaurants. Currently, besides the two Ed's Taverns, he is part owner of McGrath's Irish Ale House at Main Street at Lakewood Ranch and two other restaurants in Nokomis and Venice.

He has built a reputation as a talented businessman, and he gives credit to his father for that designation.

"My father left me the will to work," he says.

Those who know him, have worked with him, or have called him "Dad," echo the sentiment that Albert Myara works like nobody's business. But he also made a promise to himself early in life.

"When I got (out of school), I started playing tennis," Myara says. "My father played tennis, too, but I never had time for him. It was like 'Cat's in the Cradle."

"Cat's in the Cradle" is a 1974 song by Harry Chapin that become a popular hit. It tells the story of a father who worked all the time and didn't have time for his son, who eventually became just like him. They passed through life like strangers.

"By far, I am a father, and a grandfather, first," Myara says. "If my kids (sons Adam and Austin) move to Alaska, I'm moving to Alaska. I'm a softie. I promised myself I would always keep my family close."

Those around him say he has kept that promise.

"His greatest quality, bar none, is that he is such a diehard family man,"

says Bob Bender, who is Myara's partner in the original Ed's Tavern and will be a partner with him in the new Ed's Tavern venture along with Myara's son, Adam. "His family is his world, and he will do anything to encourage them and to help and to guide them."

Adam Myara, now 37, agrees with the assessment.

"The people who know him know he puts his family first above everything," says Adam, who lives a few doors down from his father in River Club. "Growing up with him, he worked a lot, but I was always with him, working in restaurants.

"I enjoyed it," he says. "It's funny now, circling back, but I remember doing deals at school. (Sports trading) cards were popular in the mid-1990s and I always was trying to sell them to my friends. Like that, working in the restaurant was a way to make money. Sure, I

missed out on some games, and people might have thought it was terrible for me to be a dishwasher, but I actually had a lot of fun."

So, what else did Adam learn from his father?

"The gutters are littered with talented people," says Adam. "They didn't have the perseverance and the drive. My father likes the saying, 'The harder you work, the luckier you get."

After his parents moved from Michigan to Tampa in 1969, Albert Myara began attending the University of South Florida with the thought of becoming Dr. Myara. However, he loved playing soccer and working in restaurants, so something had to give. He didn't finish at USF.

In the 1970s, he worked as a waiter, as a bellman and as a maître d', soaking up knowledge on how to effectively run restaurants. He also earned a real estate license, appraising during the day and working in restaurants at night.

Eventually, Myara bought his first restaurant, the Old World Cheese Shop in Longboat Key in the mid-1980s. The restaurant failed, however, because he said development plans to make that area "The Avenue of the Flowers," never materialized.

"You learn from your mistakes," he says. "Anyone who doesn't fail hasn't done anything."





In the mid-to-late-1980s, Myara worked with chain owner John Christen opening Shells Seafood restaurants. He bought two of the locations and not long afterward cashed out.

It was in the late 1990s when he went to work for John Swart, who was president of Lakewood Ranch Commercial Realty. At that time, he bought a house in River Walk Meadows.

"I fell in love (with Lakewood Ranch)," he says. "The people here were nice people, including John Swart

and (Schroeder-Manatee Ranch CEO and President) Rex Jensen."


"Albert is a great guy and we worked well together," says Swart, who sold 4 million square feet of office, retail, light industrial and hotel projects in Lakewood Ranch during his tenure at SMR. "He was very cooperative and a great listener. He was good at getting a deal done when it's difficult. He finds a wav."

"He is a very bright guy," says Swart, who is 82 and living in Mote Ranch. "Smart, committed, a hard worker. This is a complicated business. There are costs and budgets, and he is a good numbers guy."

Myara went back into the restaurant business in 2008. He was trying to buy the Crow's Nest restaurant in Venice in 2008 but ended up with Bogey's Sports Pub in Venice instead. He still has that one.

Two years after he bought Bogey's, he opened a second Bogey's location in East County, in Creekwood Crossing. He had that restaurant, which is now The Parrot, for 10 years.

Next was the original Ed's Tavern venture with Bender.

"It was 10 years ago in November," Bender says. "He sat down and listened and asked me to tell him more about myself. I could tell he was someone who helps you to get where you want to go.

"He said there was a possibility of Ed's Tavern and that I should go take a look. Somehow there was trust between us. You just kind of know sometimes. It is 10 years later, and we are still going strong. We're both high energy, but we respect each other. We have had zero disagreements. And it's funny because he was born in France and I was born in Texas, but we can almost finish each other's sentences."

"We hit it right off the bat," Myara says. "We were both nice guys. And at the time, I had two restaurants. I wanted to buy Ed's because I love (Lakewood Ranch). I really didn't want to run it. He has done a great job, and he is a great operator. Bob has almost

tripled the sales."

Now they are starting another project together with a second Ed's Tavern location. At a time when many people want to retire, Myara is going full speed ahead. He said it helps to have the support of his girlfriend of 10 years, Jackie Goudreau.

Moving forward,

Myara continues to look for business deals in the area, and he will support his two sons any way he can. Austin, who is 27, doesn't work as closely with his father as Adam, but he is involved in a trading card venture that will also include his brother.

Adam said his father makes them earn their way. He was going to law school (Stetson University in Tampa) but dropped out when he decided he didn't want to be a lawyer. The first job he landed afterward was as a breakfast server in a hotel restaurant. He had to prove himself before calling his dad. In less than a year, he was managing the front desk of the hotel and the restaurant.

He kept working on his own until his father brought him to work at Ed's Tavern so he could learn from Bender.

In 2015, the father and both sons opened Mojos Paladar, a Cuban restaurant, in Lakewood Ranch. It only lasted a couple of years.

"My wife, Yvette, is half Colombian and half Cuban," Adam says. "So, Mojos was a labor of love. But it was a small size and high rent. It took a lot of effort because many of the dishes took six hours to make. You have to sell a lot of \$8 orders to make it work."

"That was the best restaurant I've ever owned," Albert Myara says. "It was the best food."

Even if Mojos didn't work out, Myara continues to tell his boys that many successful times are ahead.

"I tell the kids that in today's world if you do what you are expected to do, you will be a star. If you do 10% more, you will be a superstar. Just remember, you want to go into a business that you can't wait to do each day. Choose your happiness, and the money will follow."



Their home is a master class in what a cosmetic remodel can accomplish. Gone is the early millennial atmosphere with its dated colors and fixtures. Now the atmosphere is crisp and modern, very on trend yet with an underlying traditionalism that gives the place a timeless atmosphere.

"A new front door and new flooring make the biggest impact," Ken says.

Although no structural changes were made, there was a lot to do.

"We started with a budget that we wanted to stay within," Katina explains. "Then we made a wish list." The list included an update to just about every element in the home. New appliances were purchased, all the cabinets were refinished, new plumbing fixtures were installed. The dated color choices from the years past were repainted in shades of white, bringing the entire house alive with light. In the kitchen were new counter tops and lighting fixtures. "We changed every surface of the interior down to the small details like doorknobs and hinges," Ken says.

Perhaps the biggest change is in the primary bathroom. The stand-alone tub in the middle of the room has been removed. The Shanahans rarely used it and the extra space only adds to the marble, spa-like luxury.

"Trim carpentry was a huge part of the project," Katina says. "We have always noted that many of the very highend homes in Lakewood Ranch have



beautiful wood detailing. We added all new casing around arches as well as wainscoting throughout the first floor."

Any other tips for would be remodelers?







# VIRGINIA SHEARER, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF SARASOTA ART MUSEUM, SHARES THE REVELATORY IMPACT OF JUDY PFAFF'S "PICKING UP THE PIECES."

"Picking up the Pieces" is Judy Pfaff's largest installation since 2017. It's described as defying boundaries. Can you explain what that means and also why you chose her work?

Judy Pfaff is widely recognized as a pioneer in installation art and celebrated globally for defining the genre. Pfaff has never been an artist with limitations; she's an innovator, and her recent works push and prod the definition of what sculpture is and can be. Stepping into a Judy Pfaff installation can be a transformative experience. I'm very curious to see how Pfaff responds to the unique architecture of Sarasota Art Museum's historic building and how her recollections of Hurricane lan's impact will manifest in this new site-specific installation. Her first museum show was in Sarasota more than 40 years ago and she later helped champion the arrival of the first and only contemporary art museum in the region when Sarasota Art Museum's founders launched ARTmuse, a visiting artist program to support renovations that would transform the former Sarasota High School building into an art museum. How could we not do a Judy Pfaff show?



We have two exhibitions this season featuring Hermitage Artist Retreat fellows. One is called "The Truth of the Night Sky: Anne Patterson and Patrick Harlin" on view April 21 to



September 29. Patterson has created wonderfully memorable work at The Ringling and we're thrilled to collaborate with her on something new and unexpected. For this presentation, she will work alongside fellow Hermitage alum and composer Patrick Harlin to create a multimedia, site-specific installation.

Do you collect art? If we visited your home, which piece would stand out?

We have an eclectic collection of artists who I have had the pleasure of knowing and working with. We display a small reproduction of a large-scale chromogenic print by the photographer Thomas

Struth entitled "Aquarium, Atlanta, Georgia." I worked with Struth to arrange the details so that conditions were right for him to make the photograph he envisioned in the largest aquarium in the U.S. on a busy spring break holiday in 2013. We made sure he got the shot, and much to my chagrin, Struth rewarded me by putting me front and center in the photograph. I wish I could afford the real thing but I am very proud that I can see the work at one of a number of major museums throughout the world when it's on view. My favorite new acquisition is an original print by John Pirman entitled "Jungle Gardens Flamingos."





# Carmine Ussano of Osteria 500

The restaurant's co-owner is grounded in Italy's culinary past. He's equally grounded in Italy's inventive, creative commitment to the future.

armine Ussano is the co-owner of Osteria 500 at Waterside Place in Lakewood Ranch. His three partners include Andrea De Dominicis, Giuseppe Del Sole (the co-owner of Napule), and Salvatore Scaccino. These Italian expatriates are fiercely proud of their heritage. Their menu proves it. From pizzas to pasta, to pistachio biscotti, it's as authentically Italian as it gets. That old-country tradition doesn't mean they're living in the past. According to Ussano, the partners embrace Italy's futuristic side as well. As he sees it, the future looks good.

# The essence of Osteria 500 is ...

Authentic Italian tradition. We're making the recipes that our grandmothers used to make. I like to tell my customers: "If you're thinking of going to Italy, just come to our restaurant. Open the door, and you jump into Italy without taking a plane. We won't even ask for a passport!"

#### "Osteria" means ...

It comes from "oste" — the Italian word for a host or innkeeper. In Italy, the original osterias were family-run restaurants that served traditional

recipes with wine. "Osteria" is part of our name because it's a good match for our old-school, Italian hospitality.

# The "500" in our name comes from ...

The Fiat 500. My partners and I have fond memories of this classic car. We were crazy enough to buy one in Italy, bring it here, and put a wood-fired oven on top of it. It fit perfectly! To us, the Fiat 500 stands for Italy's inventive, creative, futuristic side. It's new-school Italy, and that's also part of Osteria's personality.

# We turned a blue Citroen truck into an outdoor cocktail bar because ...

... we wanted to create different ambiances throughout the restaurant. One day, we decided to buy a vintage truck and refit it as an outdoor bar. Another crazy idea, hmm? But the concept behind it isn't so crazy. Like Italy itself, it's different wherever you go.

# We opened in Waterside Place because ...

... we met with the developers and they shared their vision. There was a beautiful location — with an amazing view of the lake. The project they planned would make the most of the site. So, even before they built Waterside Place, we knew it'd be perfect for Osteria 500.

# Our recipes have been passed down from our families.

Our menu's filled with dishes from our mothers and grandmothers. We were born and raised with their recipes. What else would we put on our menu?







